The Force (What is belief?)



Luke Skywalker had to learn to harness the power of the force to become a Jedi Knight. The force was a mysterious, omnipresent spirit that connected Luke to the collective power of the galaxy. Unfortunately, the force could be harnessed for both good and evil.

George Lucas, the creator of the Star Wars franchise, stated that the force "evolved out of various developments of character and plot." Lucas claims his goal was to create a concept familiar to several religions based on the premise that God exists.

The force succeeded as a common primitive desire to access a power greater than the challenges we face. The force itself had no moral compass. Instead, it was raw

energy that exists because we exist. Not surprisingly, however, only a small number of characters can tap into the power of the force whose characters evolve into superheroes and villains.

Ironically, in return, the force directed the actions of those granted supernatural power, implying that the force had a will of its own. However, what's behind the will of the force remains a mystery.

Meanwhile, outside cinema fantasy, we catch a glimpse of power similar to the force.

For example, an attacker using a large knife injured three police officers on New Year's Eve. This attack caught my attention and started my exploration down memory lane of the force. Law enforcement's investigation uncovered that the attacker targeted police officers in response to influences motivated by a radical religious group.

My mind constructed a connection between using religious beliefs to motivate harm toward others and the concept of the force. This helped me rationalize how religious leaders conclude that God empowers them to perpetrate violence against others.

In this case, I'm not referring to a domesticated version of the

force coming out of the creative genius of George Lucas. However, the results of individuals assessing this force are projected in spectacular scenes for our viewing pleasure. Instead, this force is more powerful and deadly. And it has been used for centuries by humans to manipulate others to commit acts offensive to God.

Admittedly, I'm not bothered by the language of the force depicted in Star Wars, even in a religious context. After all, there are a few similarities between the force in Star Wars, the real world, and the Holy Spirit of God. In all of these cases, we're made aware of the connectedness between us. I see this as a starting point that is healthier than isolationism.

Lately, I've been thinking a lot about our role as Christians and my role as a religious leader in public discourse about violence. I admire the clergy who lead protests that speak out against systems that perpetuate violence. The violence of racism is particularly deadly and harms both the privileged and the victims.

But what is going on in the churches located in Russia? Are the religious leaders finding a way to justify the heinous actions of the Russian political leaders? Reuters reported that the head of the Russian Orthodox Church, Patriarch Kirill, supported the war against Ukraine and called for church leaders and members to

support Putin in the murdering of innocent civilians. Of course, he used "church" language that sanitized and justified brutality.

Is this utilizing the force for evil? I can't make any rational connection to God's will. I don't want to be associated with a church led by an individual justifying murder, regardless of their argument.

Similarly, religious leaders claiming that God condones terrorism seem more connected to the force of evil than to divine power.

The force is a human-made construct that captures the motivations of any seeking to wield power beyond human ability. While this may be a starting point for conversations about belief in God, the force won't take us very far into the truth of God.

The Bible has its own depiction of a divine Force with supernatural power. And tapping into this Force also begins with the belief that God exists. But there is more to it than simply acknowledging God exists.

In the Letter of James, we're reminded that even demons believe there is only One God. But their head knowledge creates fear within them. Fear rather than humility and resentment more so than awe.







means. In doing so, he explains how embracing doubts and questions can help us to get to know God better. His aim is to help us trust God in our everyday lives, even when we don't understand everything we may want to know.

This book encourages us to ask God the hard questions that stand between us and let go of our doubts. Leaving us with the confidence to trust God, even when some questions remain. Initially published in 2015, his revised and updated edition includes biographical stories about Afshin Ziafat, C.S. Lewis, and John Piper.

Instead, it was a matter of shifting priorities. God became less important than my ambitions. I tried to keep this shift a secret while not realizing that it's obvious when this happens. And God knows long before we realize it ourselves.

Scripture is full of stories about this happening to people. The results are never good. However, God does not give up on anyone. Some of us are slow learners, and it takes a lifetime to figure it out. Sadly, too many never do and miss out on the joy that accompanies trusting God with everything.

Our new series is based on a book by Barnabas Piper titled *Help My Unbelief*. In his book, he shares his personal journey with doubt and unbelief. And you and I gain insight into what faith really means.

The book title comes from a story found in the Gospel of Mark. A man brings his son, hoping to find a cure for his son's convulsions. When Jesus confronts the man about whether he genuinely believed that his son could be healed, the man asks Jesus, "I do believe; help my unbelief!" (Mark 9:14-29).

It turns out that embracing doubts and questions can help us to get to know God better. So our hope for this series is that each of us will come to trust God in our everyday lives. Even when we don't understand everything we may want to know.

Fortunately, God never gives up on us. N. D. Wilson writes in his forward for the book that "When we cannot see, we are still seen." Jesus searches for the lost in the same way a Shepherd never gives up until a lost sheep is found.

We kick off 2023 with a dive into a struggle that is common to all believers, doubt. Few of us call our condition unbelief. But our unwillingness to be honest with ourselves does not change reality. Until and unless we fully trust God with every aspect of our lives, unbelief has a grip on us.

Knowing this reality, I've concluded that there may be some things I believe to be true about God that isn't true. This is a problem if there is a test that I'll need to pass before entering heaven. Fortunately, one of my beliefs is that there isn't an actual test. So perhaps, instead of a test, I'll experience Jesus having a belly laugh over some of my more outrageous beliefs that God finds particularly humorous.

This is the nature of belief as I've come to experience it. How about you? Do you have doubts about what you believe to be true about God?

According to his book, *Help My Unbelief*, Barnabas Piper has a few. And as a pastor and son of a pastor, I'm impressed at the questions he is willing to ask God. Some are the same as mine. But I still have questions about some of the beliefs he seems to take for granted.

One agreement we have in particular is about the Bible. We both believe God reveals precisely what God chooses to reveal in scripture. No more and no less. And scripture leaves us with more questions than answers. So why didn't God choose to tell us more?

While unsure of the answer, my guess begins with a question. Where would God stop if not where scripture stops? How many words would it take for God to fully disclose an infinite subject? Although I admit that math isn't my strongest subject, I'm pretty sure the answer is also infinite.

And I believe that God's nature continues to be revealed. However, our interpretations are imperfect and, a lot of times, downright wrong. But I believe God wants us to keep trying, which means we should never stop asking questions.

Barnabas reveals that his book's title comes from a story in Mark's Gospel. In the story, a man hopes that Jesus can heal his son. His son may have suffered from a condition beyond medical knowledge at the time. Nevertheless, the writer describes the boy's condition as possessed by an evil spirit.

Whether you believe in evil spirits is not the main point I want to highlight in this story. Jesus detected skepticism in the father's request when he added the qualification, "If you can?"

"If you can?" said Jesus.
"Everything is possible for one who believes." Is this the essence of what it means to believe? That anything and everything is possible? If so, I've got a way to go with my belief.

We read that in response to Jesus' comment, the boy's father exclaimed, "I do believe; help my unbelief!"

Elsewhere in scripture, we learn that belief of the caliber that Jesus referred to is a divine gift. But, as much as we may want to believe, we simply can't on our power. Even if we spend a lifetime studying scripture, become fluent in ancient Hebrew and Aramaic, and graduate from seminary. We are not able to fully trust God without God's help.

- 2. Read this week's article titled *The Force*. Even if you've never seen one of the Star Wars movies you should be able to identify with the idea of a mystical power greater than the problems we're facing. How is the Holy Spirit an example of the Force (capital "F") for you? Is violence ever justified? When? Does my choice of separating the force (small "f") that religious leaders use to justify violence as a way to separate their claims from God's will agree with your view of God's intentions?
- 3. How can the members of your group help you this week and on-going to help you to be more receptive to hearing and understanding the Word of God? Pray for each other to have the Holy Spirit bless you with more courage.
